Today's Bible Readings

In the Old Testament reading from one of the Wisdom books, Sirach (Ecclesiasticus), we have the image of a sieve being shaken in which the rubbish is left behind, or a kiln that tests the quality of the potter's vessels being like a man's reasoning which tests him.

In the New Testament reading St Paul looks ahead to that time when mortality and perishability will be swallowed up by immortality and imperishability. This is due to Christ's victory over death. Therefore we should remain steadfast in doing the Lord's work.

In the Gospel Jesus says that those who are spiritually blind cannot lead others. We can only admonish others when we have put our own conduct to rights. Our degree of goodness will be judged by the fruits we produce. A fully trained disciple will be like his teacher – this is the goal of the spiritual fitness training we shall undergo in Lent.
