**Today is Gaudete Sunday** – the Sunday of rejoicing that the birth of Christ is drawing near! The purple of Advent gives way to rose colour, reflected in the vestments and today's candle on the Advent wreath.

Mass on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December will be at 9.00 am instead of 6.00 pm, because of our Carol Concert.

Today's Bible Readings -

**The Old Testament reading:** The Prophet Zephaniah invites the daughter of Jerusalem to rejoice because the Lord has taken away her enemies, and is indeed himself in her midst, as the mighty one who will save.

**The second reading**: St Paul tells his Philippian converts to rejoice in the Lord always, because he is at hand. The peace of God will guard their hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

In the Gospel John the Baptist is proclaiming a gospel of repentance for he forgiveness of sins. When the crowds asked what they must do to show their repentance, John gives practical examples: share food and clothing with those who have less than you. Tax collectors must not extract more then they should; soldiers must be content with their pay. John says he is not worthy to undo the sandal strap of the one who is coming, who will baptise with the Holy Spirit and fire.

**Today:** Blessing of Bambinelli at 10.00 am Family Mass. We have invited children and families to bring the figures of the Baby Jesus for their Christmas Cribs at home, so that they can be blessed before use.

The second part of Advent begins on Tuesday, which day is known as 'O Sapientia', 'O Wisdom.' In the Gospel Acclamation at Mass, repeated as the Magnificat antiphon at Vespers, Christ is addressed by a series of Messianic texts from the Old Testament which express our longing for him to come as our Redeemer.
